## **2005 VETERANS DAY PARADE**

*By the authority of the Board of Supervisors, the following Resolution is hereby issued:*

*WHEREAS, November 11, 1918 marked the end of hostilities of World War 1 and this date has now been set aside by our nation as a time to honor our veterans and enlisted men and women of the Armed Forces of the United States; and*

*WHEREAS, the United States of America today embodies the highest ideals of freedom and democracy born out of social and political revolution and tempered by civil war and foreign conflicts; and*

*WHEREAS, in an effort to uphold our Country's ideals and standards, our veterans and enlisted men and women of the Armed Forces have been required to selflessly exhibit the qualities of sacrifice, hardship, endurance, dedication, bravery and courage; and*

*WHEREAS, there are 193,548 veterans living in Orange County who have demonstrated the highest level of patriotism, who have paid for the freedom we enjoy today, and who deserve special recognition for their accomplishments; and*

*WHEREAS, every year our Country recognizes and celebrates the invaluable contributions of our enlisted men and women and our brave veterans on November 11<sup>th</sup>; and*

*WHEREAS, this year, on November 12, 2005, the City of La Palma will again open their streets to all Orange County Veterans and enlisted men and women of the Armed Forces in celebration of our freedom by holding a parade in their honor;*

*NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Orange County Board of Supervisors do hereby recognize and honor the City of La Palma and the La Palma Days Parade celebrating 50 Years of Vision..*
